A World of Discovery

AHI Connects | Mother Emmanuel AME Church. Visit this African American Methodist Episcopal church, founded in 1816 and a touchstone of racial tension ever since. Enjoy a private tour and lecture by Lee Bennett, Jr., a retired Army officer and volunteer historian, who will speak on the church's history around issues of race.

Historic Charleston. On a guided tour, visit the historic district with an emphasis on African American contributions and history. See lovely homes along the Battery, the 18th century Rainbow Row, the College of Charleston and other notable sites. Then, visit the Philip Simmons House, a museum and workshop, preserving the legacy of the blacksmith and artist. Continue to the Old Slave Mart Museum, built in 1859, to see exhibits on the slave trade. Finish with a visit to the moving, insightful International African American Museum and Memorial Gardens.

McLeod Plantation Historic Site. Gain insight into plantation life, for both enslaved and free people who lived there, and see well-preserved antebellum architecture.

Boone Hall Plantation. Journey across the Copper River to visit one of America's oldest working plantations, established in 1681. Tour the Colonial Revival house and preserved slave cabins. Witness sweetgrass basket-making and enjoy a Gullah Culture presentation of song, dance and language.

Aiken-Rhett House Museum. Explore this well-preserved 1820 antebellum townhouse that provides a glimpse into urban slavery and their wealthy Southern owners. Explore the mansion and original slave quarters.

Avery Research Center. Once the Avery Normal Institute and hub for Charleston's African American community from 1865 to 1954, the institute joined with the College of Charleston in 1985 to preserve its legacy and to educate on the history and culture of African Americans in South Carolina.

Gullah Tour with Alphonso Brown.

Relish this special tour guided by Alphonso Brown's distinctive narration, some in native Gullah dialect with translations. Appreciate contributions made by African American Charlestonians, such as the sweetgrass basket artisans. See Denmark Vesey's home, Catfish Row and the Market.

Gibbes Museum of Art. Tour the Mary Jackson Modern and Contemporary Gallery to marvel at masterful sweetgrass baskets, paintings by Gullah Geechee artist Jonathan Green, and artworks by local and nationally recognized artists of African descent.

Rickshaw Ride to Local Restaurant.

Ride via rickshaw to commemorate your enriching week during the Farewell Dinner.
