Day 1 | In Transit

Depart your gateway city for Paris, France.

Day 2 | Paris, France | Honfleur

Upon arrival, transfer **3** to the Mercure Honfleur Hotel. After settling in, gather for tonight's Welcome Reception and Dinner.

Day 3 | Honfleur

Historic Honfleur Walking Tour. Stroll with your guide through this captivating port town that has inspired artists for centuries. From the 16th to the 18th centuries, Honfleur was an important trading seaport and a launching point for exploration. Soak up the maritime charm of the 17th-century harbor, and admire landmarks on its narrow side streets, such as the wooden Church of Sainte Catherine, crafted by 15th-century shipbuilders.

Free Time: Explore more of Honfleur this afternoon and find a cafe for lunch at leisure. Be sure to sample Normandy's enticingly fresh cheeses, including the world-class Neufchâtel, Livarot and Camembert de Normandie!

Savor regional specialties at dinner in Honfleur.

Day 4 | Arromanches | Omaha Beach | Colleville-sur-Mer | Point du Hoc

Enrichment: *D-Day & Battle of Normandy.*Discuss the critical role that Normandy played during this crucial period of the Allied war effort.

D-Day & the Battle of Normandy. Journey along the coast and stop at Pegasus Bridge,

captured by the Allies on D-Day. Then, tour the Arromanches Landing Museum and see the remains of the artificial, offshore Mulberry Harbour, a feat of engineering built by the Allies to facilitate the rapid unloading of resources, including troops and supplies, into France.

Break for lunch and travel to Omaha Beach. See the memorial and contemplate the extraordinary bravery of the Allied landing forces, who valiantly advanced under devastating fire across the heavily fortified shoreline to overcome German troops.

Then, in Colleville-sur-Mer, pay a poignant visit to the Normandy American Cemetery. Set on a beautiful bluff overlooking Omaha Beach, the cemetery contains 9,385 graves of Americans who died in the invasion and subsequent battles, as well as a tranquil memorial garden honoring those missing in action.

Finally, visit Point du Hoc, where U.S. Rangers scaled 100-foot cliffs to destroy German artillery. Understand the treacherous mission and see a German defensive displacement here. Relax over dinner on your own this evening.

Day 5 | Château du Bec | Le Havre | Musée Malraux of Modern Art

Free Time: Enjoy time at leisure this morning.

AHI Connects | Château du Bec & MuMa.

Cross the elegant, cable-stayed Pont de

Normandie over the Seine River and make

your way to Château du Bec, a 10th-century,





privately owned castle. Meet one of the owners and walk through the beautiful, wooded grounds. Then, try some of the region's flavorful beers and wines and indulge in a buffet lunch. Continue to Le Havre to visit the Musée Malraux of Modern Art (MuMa). holding one of France's largest collections of Impressionist paintings. Admire works by Monet, Degas, Renoir, Pissarro, Boudin and other masters in its bright, airy galleries. Set out to indulge in dinner at leisure tonight.

Day 6 | Mont-Saint-Michel

With one glimpse of Mont-Saint-Michel's striking silhouette rising above the surrounding flat sands, you'll quickly understand why this UNESCO World Heritage site is considered

a wonder of the Western world. Take a guided tour of this intriguing tidal island and step inside the tranquil abbey and church that have drawn pilgrims for centuries. (Active) Free Time: If you'd like, walk on the ramparts to look out over the expansive coastline. Relax over dinner on your own this evening.

Day 7 | Caen | Bayeux

Le Mémorial de Caen. At this award-winning museum, gain an international perspective of World War II, the D-Day landings, the Battle of Normandy and the Cold War through artifacts, photographs and video footage—with a focus on the war's global impact and the importance of remembrance, reconciliation and peace.

AHI Connects | Calvados. Normandy's apple cider brandy is among the world's finest brandies. Visit an estate that distills Calvados

from the apples grown on its orchards. Learn about the process, and then relish a buffet lunch and a glass of smooth Calvados.

Bayeux. View the renowned Bayeux Tapestry, an embroidered masterpiece nearly 230 feet long with more than 50 scenes related to the 11th-century Norman conquest of England. Later, admire the lovely Gothic details of Bayeux's Notre Dame Cathedral. Choose another wonderful Normandy restaurant for dinner this evening.

Enrichment: The French Resistance. Delve into the Resistance: its origins, leaders and the heroic efforts of the French patriots who fought to liberate their country.

Day 8 | Honfleur

Free Time: Your final day is yours to plan! Visit nearby museums, such as the Musée Eugène Boudin; visit local markets and stroll along the sea walls; or savor a tasty lunch and take in the local scene from a waterfront cafe.

This evening, share stories of your time in Normandy with your fellow travelers at a Farewell Reception and Dinner.

Day 9 | In Transit

After breakfast, transfer to the Paris airport for the return flight to your gateway city.



Normandy & D-Day

More than 80 years ago, one of the largest, most complex invasions in history unfolded along Normandy's coastline. It began on D-Day, June 6, 1944, when more than 160,000 Allied forces arrived by air and sea, landing in territory held by the Germans. Under the command of General Dwight D. Eisenhower, the Allied troops faced fierce resistance and sustained thousands of casualties, but they succeeded in securing the beaches and later advanced inland to liberate Paris. A tactical and psychological blow to Hitler and his troops, D-Day will be remembered forever as the moment of World War II when the tide began to turn against the Nazis.
