Day 1 | In Transit

Depart for Shannon, Republic of Ireland.

Day 2 | Shannon, Republic of Ireland | Ennis

Arrive in Shannon, transfer 3 to Ennis and check in to the hotel.

Ennis Walking Tour. Set off on a stroll through this bustling, 11th-century market town. From tales of banshees to local witches, hear how this area is steeped in legend and folklore.

Tonight, gather for a Welcome Reception and

Dinner featuring spirited music and dancing.

Day 3 | Cliffs of Moher | Ennis

Cliffs of Moher. Spend today admiring the region's countryside, coastline and unique landscapes. The majestic Cliffs of Moher rise 700 feet above the Atlantic Ocean, perched along Ireland's iconic Wild Atlantic Way. Marvel at the dramatic cliffs, sea caves and inlets, and revel in sweeping views of the Aran Islands and Galway Bay. Enjoy lunch at a traditional pub.

Enrichment: *Irish Seanchaí*. Eddie Lenihan, a premier folklorist/seanchaí, tells traditional tales of folk heroes, mythology and the supernatural.

Day 4 | Aran Islands | Ennis

Aran Island of Inishmore. Ferry across Galway Bay to the largest of the Aran Islands. As you travel on a minibus, your local guide will share entertaining stories about life on this stark, arresting island, where Gaelic is the first language. See cliffside Dun Aengus, the most famous of the Aran Islands' Bronze Age forts, and pause for lunch before your return ferry.

Irish music is beloved around the world. In Ireland, the village of Doolin is synonymous with music because of the number of musicians who live here. Enjoy an invitation into the home of a local musician. Sip some wine while listening to traditional songs and musical lore. The remainder of the evening is at leisure.

Day 5 | Ennis | Killarney

After breakfast, depart Ennis for Killarney. En route, stop in Listowel for lunch.

Jaunting Car Ride. Ride through beautiful flora, fauna and scenery on a traditional Irish horse-drawn carriage, a "Jaunting Car." These two or four-wheeled horse-drawn carts were built as a mode of personal travel beginning in the 1800s. During your ride, your driver shares tales and lore of the area. Next, board a boat for a peaceful cruise through the scenic Lakes of Killarney. Search for the rare white-tailed eagle while admiring the passing landscapes. Continue to Killarney to check in to the hotel.

Day 6 | Ring of Kerry | Killarney

Ring of Kerry. Located on the Iveragh Peninsula, the circular Ring of Kerry is among the most beautiful coastal drives. View a pastoral region seemingly untouched by time. A highlight of today is meeting a local shepherd who will demonstrate sheep herding with the help of loyal border collies.

Stop for lunch in Waterville and relish views of the Atlantic Ocean while dining. Next, drive through the villages of Caherdaniel and Sneem to Windy Gap and Ladies View. Then, enjoy a visit with "Seaweed John." Learn about different varieties of Irish seaweed from local expert John Fitzgerald.

Whiskey Tasting. Gather to learn about Irish whiskey production. While tasting local whiskey, enjoy a selection of appetizers and listen to music during this fun experience. Dinner is at leisure tonight.

Day 7 | Dingle Peninsula | Killarney

Dingle Peninsula. Depart for the picturesque Dingle Peninsula. Visit the Blasket Island

Blasket Islands Heritage Center



Heritage Center, a facility that honors the rich heritage of the people who lived on the remote Blasket Islands until the mid-1900s and the extraordinary literary legacy they left behind. Learn about the island's rich history, local life and the challenges that the islanders faced. Lunch is served at a local restaurant.

Free Time: Spend free time exploring the town's pubs, craft galleries and shops.

Day 8 | Killarney | Dublin

Following breakfast, depart Killarney for Dublin. Take in stunning views of rolling emerald-green hills along the way. Stop to explore Adare, one of Ireland's most picturesque villages. Founded in the 13th century, Adare boasts a colorful High Street and cozy, thatched-roof cottages, lively pubs and independent shops.

Arrive in Dublin and check in to the hotel. Choose to stroll through town during free time.

Day 9 | Dublin

Enrichment: *Irish Literature.* Ireland has produced four Nobel Prize winners in Literature





and Dublin is celebrated for its rich literary history. Learn about the key figures whose contributions have shaped global literature.

Dublin Walking Tour. With medieval, Georgian and Victorian architecture and lush green spaces, Dublin boasts a captivating atmosphere. Visit historic Trinity College and see the famous hand-illuminated Book of Kells. Explore St. Patrick's Cathedral, named for the Patron Saint of Ireland, and discover the shops and boutiques of Grafton Street.

Free Time: This afternoon is at leisure. Dublin offers something for everyone, from cafés and art galleries to museums and parks.

Dinner is at your leisure tonight. In Dublin, you will find a rich and diverse food culture.

Day 10 | Dublin

Dublin Food Tour. Discover traditional Irish flavors on a gastronomic walking tour. Sample quintessential Irish dishes and taste local finger foods during your excursion.

At tonight's Farewell Reception and Dinner, raise your glass and toast "Sláinte."

Day 11 | Depart for home city

After breakfast, AHI FlexAir passengers are transferred to Dublin Airport for their flight






