
Dear Alumni and Friends,

Day 1 | In Transit

Depart gateway city for London, England. 🌐

Day 2 | London, England

Touch down in London, transfer 🚗 and check in to your hotel.

Welcome to London! Join your Travel Director for a walk through the area around your hotel. The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea is home to many inviting restaurants and shops. Kick off your adventure tonight at a Welcome Reception and Welcome Dinner.

Day 3 | London

Enrichment: Black British Civil Rights.

London's Black History. Uncover 2,000 years of history during an immersive panoramic tour. While passing London's celebrated attractions, including the Tower of London, Trafalgar Square, Piccadilly Circus and other landmarks, your guide shares valuable insights, allowing you to view these famed sites through the Black British perspective. See spaces integral to London's Black communities, and learn about prominent historical figures who contributed to the city's culture, including Frederick Douglass, the British Black Panthers, Nelson Mandela and the Fisk Jubilee Singers.

Free Time: Spend the remainder of the day at leisure, exploring London at your own pace. Gather with your group for dinner at a local pub.

Day 4 | London

Black Images in the National Gallery. Join an expert to learn about works of art illustrating the Black presence in London from the 15th to the 19th centuries. The informative tour examines why the images are in the National Gallery and what the art means to us today. Discuss the morning over lunch.

Black History of Trafalgar Square.

Commissioned by King George IV, Trafalgar Square has been the center of public life in London since the 13th century. It is packed with galleries, statues, monuments and historic buildings, including the National Gallery, and the famous square has encountered a host of celebrations, political demonstrations and community gatherings. Despite the popularity of Trafalgar Square, few people know that it also holds a rich, often overlooked history.

Tower Bridge

Join your local guide to delve into the links between the African, Indian and Caribbean communities and learn why their stories remain untold.

Day 5 | London

Enrichment: *James Baldwin, Frederick Douglass & Phillis Wheatley in London.*

Secrets of Soho. While strolling between Soho Square and Russell Square, your expert guide shares insight into hundreds of years of African-Caribbean history. Discuss key events and important figures such as Marcus Garvey, Paul Robeson and Dr. Ivan Van Sertima.

Free Time: Explore this wonderful city at your leisure. Perhaps visit the British Museum or use your Oyster card to travel further.

Day 6 | London

Black Cultural Archives & Brixton. The unrivaled Black Cultural Archives is a national heritage center founded by activist Len Garrison in 1981. It is host to an extensive collection that celebrates and documents

the history and culture of people of African and Caribbean descent in Britain. Today also features a guided walk through Brixton, which has been shaped by the social and political tensions that took place here. Today, it's a hub of activity where market stalls sell everything from coffee to jewelry and Afro-Caribbean cuisine.

An Evening of Jazz. Delight in a special evening at a popular Soho jazz venue.

Day 7 | London

Thames Boat Cruise. Encounter the sights of London from a different perspective as you cruise the River Thames. Witness Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament, the Tower of London, the London Eye and the Tower Bridge.

London, Sugar & Slavery at Docklands Museum. The unique Museum of London Docklands is housed in a converted sugar warehouse and features a notable, permanent exhibit about the transatlantic slave trade.

The “London, Sugar & Slavery” exhibit hosts a variety of art, film, traditional exhibit panels and interactive screens that reveal how slavery shaped London’s economy from the 17th century onward.

Day 8 | London

Enrichment: Contemporary London, Black Culture.

St Pauls/Bank. Travel by Tube to one of London’s oldest areas. On a walking tour, see St Paul’s Cathedral, known for its splendid dome, and the Roman Amphitheatre that was discovered in 1988. Your guide shares facts about the Black presence in London and how these Black communities contributed to the city’s way of life and culture.

Free Time: A free afternoon presents time to visit the Tower of London, Churchill’s War Rooms or the Victoria & Albert Museum. Tonight, celebrate your time together at a Farewell Reception and Farewell Dinner.

Day 9 | In Transit

After breakfast, transfer ➡ to the airport for the return flight ➡ to your gateway city.

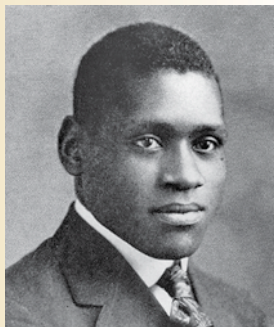
London's Luminaries

From performers to authors to activists, London was where many 20th-century African-American luminaries found welcoming communities and audiences.

Acclaimed performer, champion athlete and political activist Paul Robeson was a fierce advocate for the rights of Blacks in the United States. After moving to Britain in the 1920s to escape racism in America, he was embraced throughout London. With theater hits like "Showboat" and "Othello" and films such as "Body and Soul," he earned worldwide acclaim.

Activist Frederick Douglass lived in London for 19 months in 1845. Douglass was a prominent crusader for Black equality who reached international fame with his electrifying oratory against slavery in America. Through thousands of speeches and editorials, debates over race, class and gender, and his ground-breaking autobiography, "Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass, an American Slave: Written by Himself" (1845), Douglass became a voice of indomitable hope for his people.

Jamaican Pan-African leader Marcus Garvey founded the Universal Negro Improvement Association, a fraternal organization of Black nationalists. Garvey established *The Negro World* in 1918, which reached a circulation of over 200,000. Many sites across London honor Garvey. A public library and public park bear his name and historical markers note Garvey's last office and residence.
