Day 1 | In Transit

Depart for London, England.

Day 2 | London, England | Woodstock

Arrive in London and transfer to Woodstock. Check in to the Macdonald Bear Hotel.

Spend time exploring Woodstock, host to tea shops, inviting pubs and fine museums. Later, gather to enjoy a Welcome Reception and Dinner with your fellow travelers.

Day 3 | Oxford | Woodstock

Oxford. After a satisfying breakfast, head off to the city of Oxford to witness the oldest university in the English-speaking world. Four British kings, one pope and a host of poets, philosophers, authors, scientists and physicists graduated from Oxford. A walking tour showcases the precincts of the colleges. Along the way, take a closer look at one of the colleges.

Blenheim Palace. Welcome to Blenheim Palace, the birthplace of Winston Churchill. This majestic palace was a gift from Queen Anne to General John Churchill, 1st Duke of Marlborough to celebrate his victory at the Battle of Blenheim in 1704. Enjoy a tour of the palace's elegant staterooms, marveling at the priceless collections and portraits. Explore the formal gardens and delight in the sprawling parklands designed by "Capability" Brown.

Day 4 | Stratford-Upon-Avon

Enrichment: English Writing Tradition.

Stratford-Upon-Avon. Witness the medieval market town that kindled William Shakespeare's love stories and venerated tales. Begin at the family house of Anne Hathaway, Shakespeare's

true love, and witness her family's heirlooms.

Next, visit the Tudor thatched cottage where

Shakespeare grew up before becoming the world's greatest dramatist. Step into the rooms where he daydreamed and where he perhaps conjured up his marvelous stories of human emotion and conflict.

Delve further into Shakespearean history as you enjoy exclusive access to the UNESCO-listed Shakespeare Documents. These 400-year-old documents relate to Shakespeare's life events, business dealings and theatrical life. Archivists and Shakespeare experts share insights into the writer's life and noteworthy contributions.


Day 5 | Cotswolds Villages




located along the River Avon. Bath was built around the only natural hot spring in Great Britain, and the city was originally an exclusive spa getaway for European aristocrats. Explore the renowned Roman Baths, a true feat of engineering with chambers containing baths, heated rooms and plunge pools. Admire the stunning architecture of Bath Abbey, Pulteney Bridge and the 18th-century Georgian Royal Crescent, a row of 30 terraced houses with Georgian facades and Romanesque columns. During your tour, ponder what life must have been like in Britain so many centuries ago.

Free Time: Enjoy lunch and follow your own path in this sophisticated city. You may wish to indulge at the Thermae Bath Spa or browse Bath's glittering emporiums for a bespoke gift.

Day 8 | Woodstock

Rousham House and Gardens. Travel to the Rousham House and Gardens for a tour of the Gothic manor house and perfectly appointed grounds. Here, the English landscape style highlights the work of British architect William Kent and represents the purest example of an Augustan landscape garden, remaining almost as Kent left it. Take in the many features that delighted 18th-century visitors, such as Venus's Vale, the Cold Bath, the seven-arched Praeneste, and 'Evecatcher." a sham ruin. Three 17thcentury walled gardens delight with deep herbaceous borders that spill over the paths; peaches, apricots, plums and pear trees trained against the ancient brick walls; and a pool with a fountain surrounded by roses.

Free Time: After today's adventure, spend an afternoon at leisure in Woodstock.

Raise a toast to your fellow travelers as you cap off your final evening at tonight's Farewell Reception and Dinner.

Transfer to London airport for the return flight to your gateway city.






