



Day 1 | In Transit

Depart your gateway city for Edinburgh, Scotland. ♠

Day 2 | Edinburgh, Scotland | Dunblane

Upon arrival, transfer to Dunblane and check in to the DoubleTree by Hilton Dunblane Hydro. Tonight, gather for a Welcome Reception and Dinner, featuring a traditional haggis ceremony and a performance by Highland dancers.

Day 3 | Stirling

Enrichment: *Medieval Scotland.* Delve into the struggle for freedom and renowned figures Robert the Bruce and William Wallace.

Stirling. Set out on a guided tour and visit the 700-year-old Bannockburn battlefield. Against all odds, Robert the Bruce exploited the marshy ground there to win a decisive battle in the war for Scottish independence. Next, tour Stirling Castle, an important historic stronghold and royal residence, which was the early childhood home of Mary, Queen of Scots. Walk through the Great Hall and the royal chambers. Take in stirring views from the ramparts and the castle gardens on your own after the tour.

Free Time: See more of charming Stirling on your own and find a nice spot for lunch. Return to Dunblane for some free time before dinner with your group at a restaurant.

Day 4 | Loch Lomond | The Trossachs | Luss

Loch Lomond & The Trossachs. Delight in the magnificent scenery of this vast national park known for its splendid lochs and munros, or mountains. Begin with a cruise on Loch Lomond. Later, stop in the pretty village of Luss, filled with slate cottages originally built for workers at the nearby slate quarries. Take a break for lunch at a lakeshore restaurant in Luss, then admire the picturesque vistas on a drive through the heart of the Trossachs.

Day 5 | St Andrews

Enrichment: The Stewart Line & the Jacobite Rebellions. Examine the period from Mary, Queen of Scots, through the Stewart line.

St Andrews. On your way to St Andrews, see the National Wallace Monument. Then, tour





St Andrews' medieval castle ruins at the edge of the sea with your guide. Afterward, visit the 12th-century cathedral ruins and envision the church's scale and grandeur. See golf's most iconic turf, the St Andrew's Old Course, where the sport has been played since the 1400s.

Try tasty specialties during lunch in town.

Free Time: See more of the town or browse in the shops before returning to Dunblane.

Day 6 | Edinburgh

Edinburgh. On your way to Edinburgh, see the Forth Bridge, a historic cantilever railway bridge that opened in 1890. One of Europe's most distinguished capitals, Edinburgh is a showstopper, spread across seven hills and brimming with remarkable architecture. On a panoramic tour, get wonderful perspectives of the medieval Old Town and elegant

Georgian New Town, designated together as a UNESCO World Heritage site. After lunch in town, stroll along the Royal Mile before touring Edinburgh Castle. Marvel at the crown jewels, the Stone of Destiny and more. (Active)


Free Time: Make plans for dinner on your own before the Tattoo performance.

Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo. Tonight, revel in this unforgettable show performed before the floodlit castle. First staged in 1950, this impressive annual spectacle combines regimental pipes and drums, military bands from around the world, Highland dancers and fireworks.

Day 7 | Dunblane | Perth | Crieff

Free Time: Enjoy the morning at leisure and lunch on your own, then depart for Perth.

Scone Palace & the Glenturret Distillery.

In Perth, visit Scone Palace, where Scottish kings, including Robert the Bruce, were crowned. Take a tour of the stately rooms, then wander through the lovely grounds and perhaps try to find your way through the Murray Star Maze. Next, head to Crieff for a visit to Glenturret Distillery. Established in 1775, it is Scotland's oldest working distillery. Savor a tasting of its fine single malt whisky.

Day 8 | Dunblane

Enrichment: Scotland Today. Discuss current issues affecting life in Scotland.

Free Time: Create your own agenda for the rest of the day. Perhaps you'll visit Glasgow, return to Stirling or stay in Dunblane. Your Travel Director can help you plan your day. At tonight's Farewell Reception and Dinner, enjoy a ceilidh, a fun Celtic party, with your fellow travelers and celebrate the wonderful time you've shared in bonnie Scotland. Learn some classic Scottish songs and dances!

Day 9 | In Transit

Transfer **3** to the Edinburgh airport for the return flight **4** to your gateway city.




