Lauren (Robin) Derby's research has treated dictatorship and everyday life, the long durée social history of the Haitian and Dominican border, and how notions of race, national identity and witchcraft have been articulated in popular media such as rumor, food and animals. Her current project is based on oral testimony of demonic animal phantasms in Haiti and the Dominican Republic and considers werewolf encounters in light of the animal turn. She is professor of history at UCLA where she teaches courses on modern Latin America and Caribbean history, cultural history and food studies. She has lectured on past UCLA Alumni Travel tours, and been conducting research in Cuba since 1995.

Historic Old Havana

Day 1 | Miami, Florida | Havana, Cuba

Depart Miami for Havana. Arrive, transfer and check in to the Casa Italia hotel.

Welcome Dinner. Gather with your fellow travelers for dinner at a privately owned and operated local restaurant. Meet and support local entrepreneurs on your first night in Cuba!

Day 2 | Havana

Enrichment: Havana’s Architecture.

Old Havana. Begin your Cuban discovery with a guided walk through La Habana Vieja and its lively four main squares: Plaza de Armas, Plaza de San Francisco, Plaza Vieja and Plaza de la Catedral, teeming with daily life. Step into the Havana Cathedral, consecrated in 1782 and the seat of Havana’s archdiocese. During your walk, stop by Dador, an independently owned clothing store founded by three Cuban women. Hear from staff about their creative mission and the challenges and rewards of owning and operating a female-led business in Havana. Stop for lunch at a casual café in Old Havana.

Enrichment: The Cuban Economy.

Day 3 | Havana

Norma Guillard. Meet distinguished Cuban social psychologist and adjunct lecturer at the University of Havana, Norma Guillard. Watch “Maestra,” a documentary about the female volunteers who taught over 900,000 Cubans to read and write during the 1961 Cuban Literacy Campaign. Guillard will share stories about her involvement at age 15, as well as her ongoing work and writing in support of Cuban women, followed by an engaging discussion.

National Museum of Fine Arts. Join Wilfredo Benítez of the Ludwig Foundation for a tour of this vital cultural institution. He’ll offer insightful commentary on specific Cuban works held at the museum, which features a Cuban art, from colonial-era and 19th-century works to modern, revolutionary, and avant-garde art.

Discuss your morning’s insights over lunch.

Vintage Convertible. Hop into one of Cuba’s legendary, classic 1950s American convertibles for a ride along Havana’s Malecón sea drive. Peek beneath the hood and chat with your friendly driver to gain insight into their ingenuity and resourcefulness in maintaining the cars.

Day 4 | Havana

Enrichment: Empowering Cuban Women.

Jewish Culture & Cuban Dance. Visit the Ashkenazi Community Center to gain insight into Cuba’s Jewish culture. Stop at Malpaso, a contemporary dance studio to watch the

talented company perform a moving dance arrangement for you. Afterward, engage in a Q&A with the dancers to understand their passion, training and dedication to dance.

La Finca Vigía. Visit Ernest Hemingway's home, estate and museum, where the author lived from 1939 to 1960 and wrote the Nobel Prize-winning "The Old Man and the Sea."

Ludwig Foundation. Later, gather on the terrace of this nonprofit institution, dedicated to protecting and promoting Cuban artists and culture. Engage in intellectual exchanges with local artists to hear about and view their art.

Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant tonight.

Day 5 | Havana | Matanzas

Matanzas & The Slave Route. Journey to the province of Matanzas today, pausing en route to admire sweeping views of the lush Yumurí Valley. Visit San Severino Castle, the 1735 fortress where enslaved African people were brought during the 18th century. Next, stop at the Museo Farmacéutico building in the city center to delight in a performance by an a

cappella chamber choir, followed by a Q&A session with the singers. Step in briefly to admire the beautifully preserved, original French-style pharmacy, founded in 1882, as you depart.

Savor a delicious farm-to-table lunch nearby.

Sugar Mill Triunvirato. Visit the 19th-century sugar plantation and site of the 1843 Slave Rebellion for a tour of the plantation house and exhibits on slavery and the Angola War. View the Monument to the Slave Rebellion.

Back in Havana, gather for dinner at the hotel.

Day 6 | Havana

Enrichment: Race & the Cuban Revolution.

Agromercado. Step into the daily lives of local Cubans during an interactive, fun shopping excursion to a bustling local farmers' market.

El Callejón de Hamel. Immerse yourself in this eclectic alleyway, brimming with vibrant street art and rumba drumming. Gain insight into Cuba's oldest community art project and the diversity of Cuban religions that have emerged.

Inside an Art Studio. Visit Casa Fuster, the studio of Picasso-inspired Cuban painter and sculptor José Fuster. View the artist's vibrant, fantastical mosaics, hear about his work and

Learn about their reforestation mission and daily lives during visits to a local café, daycare, doctor's office and artist's studio, followed by a lunch including locally grown vegetables and live entertainment.

Day 8 | Havana | Miami, Florida

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for the return flight to Miami, Florida, and connection to your home city.
