Historic Havana

Day 1 | Miami, Florida | Havana, Cuba

Depart Miami for Havana. Upon arrival, check in to the Claxon Hotel.

Tonight, gather for a Welcome Dinner at a local *paladar*, a privately owned and operated restaurant. Meet and mingle with locals on your first night in Cuba.

Day 2 | Havana

Enrichment: Havana's Urban Planning & Architectural Challenges.

Enigmatic Old Havana. Enjoy your first look at this UNESCO World Heritage destination and its four main squares: Plaza de Armas, Plaza de San Francisco, Plaza de la Catedral and Plaza Vieja. These vibrant plazas teem with local life, from men playing dominos to colorful flea markets and children playing soccer. Chat with habaneros, resident vendors, before continuing to Dador, an independently owned clothing store founded by Cuban women where we will learn about their experiences with starting and owning a female-led business in Cuba.

Enrichment: U.S. & Cuban Relations.

Day 3 | Havana

Havana by Car. Hop aboard a classic convertible for a ride through Havana's historic quarter. Enjoy interacting with your friendly driver. If you wish, peek beneath the hood and learn how these cars are maintained, including the challenges of getting access to necessities.

Contemporary Art. Join Wilfredo Benítez of the Ludwig Foundation to explore Cuban art collections at the National Museum of Fine Arts.

Enrichment: Cuba's Justice System.

Day 4 | **Havana**

Enrichment: Empowering Cuban Women.


Jewish Center & Cuban Dance. Visit the Sephardic Hebrew Center where a member of Havana's Jewish Community provides a tour. Continue to a contemporary dance studio for a look into Cuba's infectious dance scene. Meet some dancers and learn about their lives and commitments to their art and training.

La Finca Vigia. After lunch, head outside of Havana to visit Ernest Hemingway's modest home where he wrote "The Old Man and the Sea" and other famous books.

Later today, visit the Ludwig Foundation, a nonprofit cultural institution that is dedicated to protecting and promoting Cuban artists.

Meet independent local artists and learn about their desires to pursue artistic ventures. Sit down to dinner at the Hotel Nacional.

Day 5 | Matanzas | Havana

Matanzas. Cuba underwent a long period of slavery from 1511 until 1886. Today, Afro-Cuban roots remain profound across the island, especially in Matanzas. Tour the San Severino Museum, a castle built by slave labor to protect the city against attacks. This symbolic museum has many objects and photos illustrating slavery times. Learn about the history of the slave trade and how Afro-Cuban culture is celebrated through art, music, language and other expressions. Also visit the Sugar Mill Triunvirato, the site of the 1843 Rebellion of the Triunvirato. Cap off your excursion to Matanzas with a fun performance by a local choir!

Share your insights and thoughts of the day over a delicious lunch at a paladar.

Enrichment: The Cuban Revolution & Race.

Day 6 | Havana

Norma Guillard. This Cuban social psychologist and adjunct lecturer at the University of Havana shares stories about her work. Watch "Maestra," a documentary about female volunteers who taught more than 700,000 Cubans to read and write during the Cuban Literacy Campaign.

Local Market & Street Scenes. Stop at an agromercado, a street market selling fruits, vegetables and varieties of meats and beans. This is a great way to witness daily life in Cuba! Next, explore the charismatic and lively Callejón de Hamel. This paint-splashed, music-filled alley is a central part of Afro-Cuban culture, a fusion of African and European religious practices.

Inside an Art Studio. Tour Casa Fuster, the studio of Cuban painter and sculptor Jose Fuster, and talk with an artist about

his work and the opportunities for local artists. Enjoy lunch at Casa Fuster.

La Casa de la Cultura & Afro-Cuban Dance.

La Casa de la Cultura promotes art, culture and literature within Cuba and offers workshops on music, dance, theater and other artistic areas. Visit the center and engage with the staff and children. Next, enjoy an intimate gathering with local dancers who share their passions for teaching tango and salsa. You can try a few steps yourself if you wish!

Day 7 | Cuban Countryside | Havana

Rural Cuba. Travel to the island's countryside, where identity is firmly planted in agriculture. Take in views of untamed beauty, passing tobacco and sugarcane fields, valleys and villages. Visit a small community and meet with farmers and others to learn about their day-to-day lives in rural Cuba.

Relax with your fellow travelers over a lunch of locally sourced produce.

Enrichment: Rhythms of Cuban Music.

Raise a toast to your Cuban adventure during a Farewell Dinner at a family-owned paladar.

Day 8 | Havana | Miami, Florida

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for the return flight to Miami, Florida.


