

Day 1 | In Transit

Depart your gateway city for Paris, France.

Day 2 | Paris, France | Honfleur

Upon arrival, transfer to the Mercure Honfleur Hotel. After settling in, gather for tonight's Welcome Reception and Dinner.

Day 3 | Honfleur

Historic Honfleur Walking Tour. Stroll with your guide through this captivating port town that has inspired artists for centuries. From the 16th to the 18th centuries, Honfleur was an important trading seaport and a launching point for exploration. Soak up the maritime charm of the 17th-century harbor, and admire landmarks on its narrow side streets like the wooden Church of Sainte Catherine crafted by 15th-century shipbuilders.

Free Time: Set off to see more of Honfleur on your own and find a nice spot for lunch. Be sure to sample Normandy's enticingly fresh cheeses, including the world-class Neufchâtel, Livarot, Camembert de Normandie and Pont-l'Evêque! Enjoy regional specialties at dinner in Honfleur.

Day 4 | Le Mont-Saint-Michel

Mont-Saint-Michel. With one glimpse of Mont-Saint-Michel's striking silhouette rising above the surrounding flat sands, you'll quickly understand why this UNESCO World Heritage site is considered a wonder of the Western world. Tour this intriguing tidal island with your guide, and step inside the tranquil abbey and church that have drawn pilgrims for centuries.

If you'd like, walk on the ramparts to look out over the expansive coastline. (Active)

Day 5 | Caen | Utah Beach | Sainte-Mère-Église

Le Mémorial de Caen. At this award-winning museum, expand your understanding of World War II, the D-Day landings and the Battle of Normandy through thought-provoking exhibits, detailed artifacts and multimedia presentations.

CAHI Connects | Calvados. Normandy's apple cider brandy is among the world's finest brandies. Visit an estate that distills Calvados from the apples grown on its orchards. Learn about the process, and then relish a delectable lunch and a glass of smooth Calvados.

Utah Beach and Sainte-Mère-Église.

The Normandy coastline provided the theater for Operation Overlord, one of history's largest and most complex military operations. In the early hours of June 6, 1944, Allied paratroopers began landing inland, tasked with sealing off German access to the amphibious assault sites. By daybreak, the second phase started as Allied landing forces came ashore on five beaches codenamed Utah. Omaha. Gold. Juno and Sword. As you visit the Musée du Débarquement at Utah Beach, learn gripping details about the planning and execution of the invasion. Travel next to Sainte-Mère-Église, where U.S. paratroopers from the 82nd and 101st Airborne divisions landed chaotically amid enemy fire and later secured its strategic crossroads. It was the first French town liberated by the Allies.


Day 6 | Château du Bec

Château du Bec. Cross the elegant, cable-stayed Pont de Normandie over the Seine River and make your way to Château du Bec, a 10th-century, privately owned castle. Meet one of the owners and walk through the beautiful, wooded grounds. Then, try some of the region's flavorful beers and wines and indulge in a buffet lunch.

Enrichment: The French Resistance. Delve into the Resistance: its origins, leaders and the heroic efforts of the French patriots who fought to liberate their country.

Free Time: Select a special place for dinner. Your Travel Director can assist with planning.

Day 7 | Arromanches | Omaha Beach | Normandy American Cemetery | Pointe du Hoc

Enrichment: *D-Day and the Battle of* **Normandy.** Gain insights about the pivotal role that Normandy played during this critical period of the Allied war effort.

D-Day and the Battle of Normandy. Begin in Arromanches, where you'll see the site of an offshore mulberry harbor and visit the museum there. These floating harbors enabled the Allies to funnel enormous resources into France to wage war against Hitler. Afterward, walk along Omaha Beach, see the memorial and reflect upon the exceptional courage of the Allied landing forces, who valiantly advanced under devastating fire across the heavily fortified

shoreline. Next, visit the Normandy American Cemetery, which contains the graves of 9,387 Americans who died in the invasion and ensuing battles as well as a memorial garden honoring those missing in action. Continue to Pointe du Hoc, where U.S. Rangers scaled 100-foot cliffs to destroy enemy artillery. Hear about this treacherous mission and go inside a German defensive emplacement. During today's excursion, take a break for lunch at a restaurant.

Day 8 | Bayeux | Honfleur

Bayeux. View the renowned Bayeux Tapestry, an embroidered masterpiece nearly 230 feet long with more than 50 scenes related to the 11th-century Norman conquest of England. Later, admire the lovely Gothic details of Bayeux's Notre Dame Cathedral.

Free Time: Enjoy time at leisure in Bayeux for lunch before returning to the hotel. This evening, share stories of your time in Normandy with your fellow travelers at a Farewell Reception and Dinner.

Day 9 | In Transit

After breakfast, transfer to the Paris airport for the return flight to your gateway city.

80th Anniversary of D-Day

Eighty years ago, one of the largest and most complex invasions in history unfolded along Normandy's coastline. It began on D-Day, June 6, 1944, when more than 160,000 Allied forces arrived by air and sea, landing in territory held by the Germans. Under the command of General Dwight D. Eisenhower, the Allied troops faced fierce resistance and sustained thousands of casualties, but they succeeded in securing the beaches and later advanced inland to liberate Paris. A tactical and psychological blow to Hitler and his troops, D-Day will be remembered forever as the moment of World War II when the tide began to turn against the Nazis.
